As I attended the closing worship at this summer's Western North Carolina Annual Conference, I listened nervously as Bishop Ken Carter declared all the appointments for 2022-2023 were "fixed."

It's a traditional statement, something every bishop says before we leave Lake Junaluska. It's a declaration that the new appointment year has begun, and the list of appointments prayerfully worked out by the bishop and others is finally official.

For some pastors, hearing those words means the move for which they've been preparing themselves and their families is now imminent. They will leave Junaluska to load boxes onto U-Haul trucks, say their goodbyes, and begin ministry in a new community.

For other pastors, hearing those words means returning to a ministry appointment to begin another year of preaching the gospel, providing the sacraments, and giving thanks alongside fellow Christians for the love of God revealed in Jesus Christ.

It's hard to believe it's been a year since I began my ministry with Midway Church. Since I arrived in the parish in July 2021, I've worshipped God with you. I've celebrated with you. I've grieved with you. I've searched the Scriptures with you. I've prayed with you. I've dreamed of new ministry with you.

As I stood in Stuart Auditorium and listened to hear the bishop say the appointments are "fixed," I felt nervous, as I always do. But I also felt a great sense of anticipation. I am grateful to be serving with you at Midway Church, and I'm eager to continue building on our shared beginning as we enter a second year of ministry together.

July 4th prayer




On Father's Day we honored our fathers. Congratulations to all who received the Lowe's Gift Cards. We appreciate and love and honor all of our fathers at Midway.


